

Some or Any

Some and any: used with countable and uncountable nouns.

Some / any + plural

Some / any + singular

“Some”

Some is used with positive statements.

Compounds : something , someone , somebody, and somewhere.

Example some:

There are **some** computers in the shop.

Send me **some** text messages.

I see **some** people text street.

Some is used in question, where you're sure about the answer.

“Any”

Any is used in questions.

Any is used with not in negative statements.

Compounds: anyone, anything, anywhere.

Example any:

She **didn't** want **any** cheese.

We **don't** send him **any**.

There **aren't** **any** pupils in school.

Any is used in question with positive or negative answer.

Example: Has anyone seen Tom?

Any is used in positive sentences with hardly, never and without.

Examples some or any :

Manee bought **some** books. (some-positive sentence)

Did you get **any** candles? {Any – question}

We **don't** have **any** money. { Any – negative sentence}
