Debsirin School Alumni's Pride of Tunku Abdul Rahman, the first Prime Minister of Malaysia

I always say that the boxer like Sisaket must have the same goal as Manny Pacquiao. Sisaket boxed and earned 8 million Bahts which was high. Manny Pacquiao's matches stop the world. Each time, he earns billion Bahts. Sisaket's

management should find opportunities for him to box in large city like Las Vegas. Moreover, he should network with the powerful promoters so that Sisaket's match can stop the world like Manny Pacquiao did. Sisaket has good path and opportunities.
